

SECRET HIEROGLYPHIC MESSAGES


Writing secret messages in hieroglyphs is a great way to learn to write hieroglyphs and have fun too. The more messages you send the easier it becomes. You don't have to be an artist to write with hieroglyphs. You can use the Horus-Basic font with your computer. If you're artistic you can draw your own, referring to the Hieroglyphic Translations chart.

Writing in Egyptian hieroglyphs is fun because hieroglyphics are written phonetically. You write a word like it sounds, not like it's spelled. If you can't hear a letter in ordinary speech, leave it out of your messages.



You also leave out vowels <u>except</u> if the first letter is a vowel or if the last letter is a vowel and it is sounded when spoken. If you are writing *Let's go to town today*, you would write: **Its go to twn tday.** *Go* has to be **go** because if you only wrote **g** your reader might not understand what you mean.

Double letters aren't written either.



If you do see duplicate letters, there is probably a vowel used between the double letters.



Sometimes it helps to have vowels. If a word begins with a vowel you should include the vowel. A vowel at the end of a word is included only if it is sounded when spoken.

Always include vowels at the beginning of a word.



Because *a* is the first vowel it needs to be included or the word won't be recognizable. The other vowels are left out.


Vowels at the end of a word are not important unless they are spoken. Silent vowels can be left out.



The *a* which is the final vowel must be written because it is sounded when the word is pronounced.


The final *e* is silent and therefore left out. If you don't pronounce the vowel don't included it.

With secret messages, some words can be represented with a single character.



It is important to write unfamiliar words or names in full—words like Cairo. Otherwise you might not recognize the word and mistake its meaning for another word.


As you get more experienced you can abbreviate words you use a lot. It makes it even easier and more fun. Use the usual abbreviations you would use when taking notes, but substitute hieroglyhphic symbols for the English letters.



Use the Hieroglyphic Translations chart as a guide. It is given separately so you can keep it beside you to simplify translations. When you write secret messages you can refer to it when you need to know which hieroglyphs represent which sounds. As you become more familar with the characters it will get easier. Refer to this list when you write and you'll learn them without noticing. If you decide to learn more about hieroglyphs you will already know the basic sounds.

Writing hieroglyphs is fun. Only people who know them can read the secret messages.

USING A COMPUTER

If your computer uses Windows you can use the Paint program to create glyph messages that can be emailed. Open the Paint program, select the type tool, check that the font is set to Horus, and enter the message. Type the messages in lower case to keep your messages secret. Type in all CAPITAL letters or use the *caps lock* key to see the letters in the message and make it easy to read. After you are completed with the message, save the file as a .GIF file to the *My Documents* folder. Attach the message file to your email and send it to your friends.

You can also use your computer to type messages. Horus-Basic will work for most of your needs and can be downloaded from: www.greatscott.com/downloads.html The Horus-Basic font includes hieroglyphic equivalents for every letter. Just type a letter

and the hieroglyph appears. Each hieroglyph is accompanied by the letter it represents. By typing in capital letters you can make your messages secret. The Horus computer font, does not include periods or commas. Leave two spaces to show the end of a sentence.
